

Three Ways to Use Concepts and Themes

RADAR version 7 offers you a completely new approach to finding symptoms and remedies. You can now search several books (depending on the package you purchased) in Concepts and Themes.

Concepts and Themes represent a spider web of information stretching throughout the Synthesis Repertory, greatly increasing access to all symptoms by starting from a patient's words or expressions. These may represent specific clinical pictures, or more general symptom concepts such as "dullness", "animals", "nausea", etc. You can then see which rubrics in the Synthesis are part of the concept and look at the corresponding remedies.

The Concepts and Themes are grouped together in a separate repertory which opens automatically when opening the Synthesis. There are basically three routes to follow:

1. You can find a symptom in the Synthesis Repertory and see whether there are any Concepts available for the symptom (indicated by the icon). If there are, you can open the book which contains the Concept and consult any other symptoms described in the book. We call this: Finding a concept from a rubric.
2. You can also open one of the books holding the Concepts and find the clinical picture you are looking for. From there you can open a list of all the rubrics which may be valid for the clinical picture or concept.
3. Concepts may also be attached to remedies.
